The Maid of Armagh is unique because it changes keys in the middle of the tune, from A major to D major.*The chords printed in the B part of Britches are an invention of mine! If you want to keep it simple (sometimes very advisable), the chords in the A part work perfectly in the B. This is a very popular polka!

Irish Waltz

It should be played with a lot of emphasis on the rhythm, especially when the melody is syncopated. You should also try to add as many double stops as possible, on the open strings above or below the melody that fit the chords.
